

Dear Charles:

We are writing to provide you with a written proposal concerning assistance with the class action litigation commenced in respect of *Kranjcek v. Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario*.

As requested, we are writing to propose a fee to assist you in having the court appoint our firm to prepare the trust return, and to calculate the tax estimate prior to the distribution of the funds.

Claims Administrator Role:

Our role would be limited to reviewing the total income earned during the period and calculating the tax to be withheld prior to distribution and to prepare the necessary income tax filings.

Proposed Fee:

Based on the above understanding, we propose a fixed fee of \$5,000.00 for the tax filings and other assistance as outlined. We expect that there will be a requirement to file two years of income tax filings given that the funds being distributed may not be cleared completely by the bank and that some of the payments may need to be followed up over time.

We suggest that 75% of the fee would be paid at the time of completing the first income tax return and that the remaining balance would be paid at the completion of the second income tax return.

- We were appointed to be claims administrator for legal action commenced on February 10, 1999 by Thelma Crawford on behalf of class members against the Corporation of the City of London, which action was certified as a class action on December 10, 2000.

As part of this administration we received the claims material, reviewed the material and supporting documentation, communicated and corresponded directly with the class member for additional support, approved or rejected certain claims, administered an appeal process and submitted one appeal to the court, processed payments from a fund for approval claims and filed the necessary tax forms and other formal reports as required.

In total 601 claims were approved as filed or at a reduced amount.

 - Ethylene, Propylene, Diene, Monomer (EPDM)


